- Year 6 – Miss Emily Hill

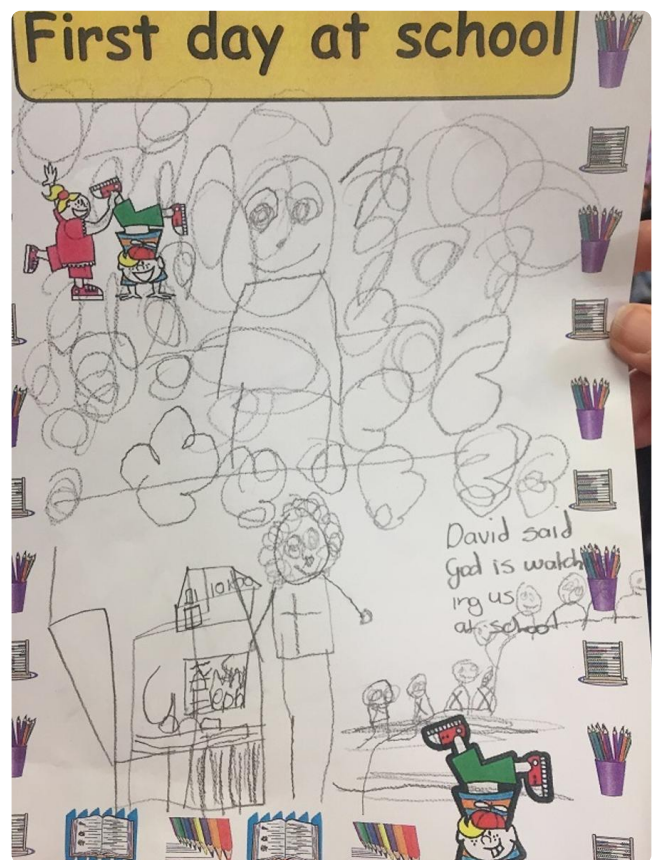
We also welcome all our new families to St Andrews. May your time here be a wonderful blessing, not only for your child/children, but to you as well.

Beginnings

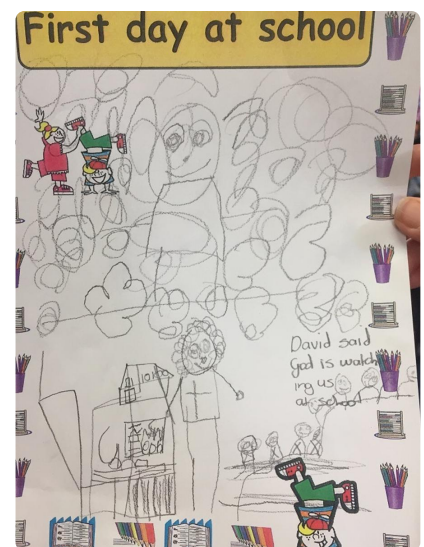

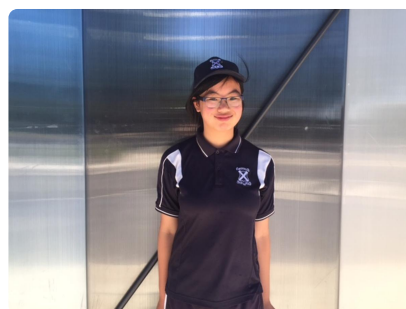

Welcome Back!

The Senior Library received its new furniture over the school holidays. The students have enjoyed trying the pieces out. The new collaboration area has been especially popular.

We have a steady stream of students using the space for study throughout the day. At lunch and recess, students come to study, read and play quiet games.

Would You Like To Help?

There are several ways in which parents can help the library.

1. If you can't make it during the day or you prefer to work from home, we can offer book covering. We will pack a box of books for you to take home and cover within a week. We also provide the contact and instructions.
2. If you are able to come to the school and are available at the beginning or end of the school day, we can offer shelving. For this task, we ask for a commitment of half an

hour to an hour, once a week, for one term.

3. You can also help with library tasks once or twice a year. This can include covering books at school, shelf sorting, shelving etc.

If you would like to help, contact the library staff by telephone, email or in person. Please include your name, a contact telephone number and / or an email and your child's name and year level and how you wish to help- shelving (if this, please let us know which day and time you prefer e.g. Mondays am or Fridays pm and the term) or covering (spread throughout the year).

We are looking for shelveers for Terms 2, 3 and 4. If you would like to shelve, a valid Working with Children Check is required. Young children are also welcome in the library.

Accelerated Readers

The Accelerated Reader program has commenced. This is a reading program for Years 4-6. Students complete a

placement test (STAR Reading test) and are given recommended reading levels. They choose books in the appropriate range, read and complete an online test. This will earn points and students will have a goal to work towards each term.

If you would like to know more about this program, please speak to your child's classroom teacher or to Mrs Edwards or Mrs Marks.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge (VPRC)

Students in Years 7 and 8 will participate in the Victorian Premiers' Challenge as part of their English program. Students select books from a list provided and are required to read a minimum of fifteen titles to join the Honour Roll. More information can be found here.

Dental Services



Free Dental Care is not just for Health Care Card Holders.

The Child Dental Benefit Scheme introduced by the government on January 1st 2014, is continuing. It entitles all eligible children aged 2-17 years old to general dental care up to the value of \$1000 over 2 years. Families who receive Family Tax Benefit Part A or a relevant Australian Government payment will receive a letter outlining their eligibility. Children and youth who attend public dental clinics will not incur out of pocket expenses with the Child Dental Benefit Schedule.

Our normal dental care continues to operate for all 0-12 year old children and eligible 13-17 year old youth at no cost. (Youth must be a holder or dependent of a health care or pensioner concessioner card holder, in out-of-home care provided by Department of Human Services or in Custodial Care).

Following their treatment, your child will be placed on our patient recall system and receive a reminder letter when their next appointment is due.
