For specific prayer requests, there is a prayer request box at the front reception desk for you to put your request in if you are unable to join us.


We are greatly blessed at St Andrews to have the opportunity to gather together

Australia -ASEAN Youth Forum - 2 September 2016

Six of our students from Year 10 participated in the Australia – ASEAN Youth Forum on 2nd September at Melbourne University. A total of 11 schools participated in the Forum and schools represented either Australia or one of the 11 ASEAN countries as country delegates and debated on three key issues that have great significance in this region : trade, climate change and refugees.



Our school was chosen to represent Australia and our delegates, Raaya Singh and Hewett Ng delivered Australia's position on the three issues at the 1st plenary session. Following this, at the 2nd plenary session, all delegates engaged in a round of discussion and debate to arrive at three declarative statements for each issue and finally, at the 3rd plenary session, delegates voted on the Forum Declaration.

It was an extremely enriching experience for our students . The Forum increased their knowledge and understanding of the member countries of ASEAN and Australia's relationship with the region. In addition , the Forum was an excellent opportunity for students understand the benefits and challenges of regional dialogue, intergovernmental cooperation and conflict resolution.




