■ College Commencement Date for Years 1-12 in 20245

The first day of school for 2025 (for Years 1-12) will commence on: Friday 31st January 2025.

■ College Commencement Date for Preps Only

The first day of school for 2025 (for Preps only) will commence on:

Monday, 3rd February 2025 (See page 5 for further details regarding Prep times and dates)

■ College Start Time:

Students commence school at 9:00am each morning. The first bell rings at 8:55am for a 9:00am start each day. If a student is late, they are required to sign in at the front office and provide a reason for being late (see page 7 regarding the process for Late Arrivals and Early Departures). On the first day (Friday 31st January), students will commence with a whole school assembly.


From Monday 3rd March onwards, Prep children will attend school full time, Monday to Friday

■ Attendance

It is a College requirement that all enrolled students attend every day that the College is in session with exception to the following circumstances:

- Unwell/Family Appointment
- Approved absences, e.g. holidays
- Removal by College staff, e.g. head lice
- Having been suspended or expelled

An official record of attendance is maintained daily.

In the event that a child is unable to attend school, the College should be notified with a reason prior to the commencement of the day via 'the hub' app – see page 8 for link info.

Notice of absence can also be given via email: attendance@standrews.vic.edu.au and cc the student's teacher (John Smith - email address is jsmith@standrews.vic.edu.au).

If parents have no access to email, written notification is required to be submitted to Reception.

■ Late Arrivals and Early Departures

Students arriving late or leaving early must be signed in/out by parent/guardian at the Reception.

Students are required to remain on College grounds during school times except in instances where an accompanying parent/guardian, or a person authorised by a parent/guardian is present. A receipt of written permission from a parent/guardian for the student to leave the College grounds is required.

When a student needs to leave the grounds during the school day, the student is to be collected from Reception and must sign in at the Reception on his/her return if returning on the same day.

■ Unapproved Absences

If a student is absent without written parental consent, the student's residential guardian will be contacted via SMS to verify the absence to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the student.

■ Extended Absences

Where it is planned that a student is to be absent from school for an extended period (1 week or more), a request is to be made in writing to the principal prior to the leave date.





What is the hub?



'the hub' is a powerful Learning Management System and Information Portal that has been specifically designed to build genuine partnerships between students, parents, teachers and the College.

It is a powerful tool that collates and integrates every facet of College life into one comprehensive, private and convenient location. 'the hub' is also an on-line site where teachers, parents and students can connect, communicate and collaborate on virtually anything.

Things such as course information, student timetables, assignments, academic reports, assessment results, teacher feedback, daily calendar events and more are contained on 'the hub'.

Anything you want to know about College life is on 'the hub'.

There you will find the 'user guide' that will guide you through everything you need to know about registering, downloading, installing and using the hub app.

New families will be provided login information prior to commencement.





At St Andrews Christian College we take the health and safety of our students very seriously. As such, we have a health, safety and electronic consent form system called Operoo.

Operoo is used by many schools, clubs and other groups who have a duty of care responsibility. It provides you the opportunity to update medical information promptly and accurately while providing the school with instant access to the emergency information provided by you. The use of this system reduces the burden on you to fill out the same information on multiple forms throughout the year. Some of you may already using Operoo with other organisations.

You can use a PC, laptop, tablet or smartphone to enter the details including:

- · emergency contacts
- medical contacts
- medical checklist including asthma, allergies, seizures and diabetes
- health and ambulance insurance details
- notes and other care instructions from you
- medical action plans
- permissions and information for excursions
- and more...

As a parent/guardian you will receive an invitation to join Operoo and enter details for your child/children. By following the instructions, you can create your own free Operoo account and control all data about your child/ children. The Operoo system stores the information on your behalf and you will be able to grant access to your data with our school. You are also able to share this data with any other group or individual you choose (e.g. your child's grandparents, their child-minder, their sports club, etc.).

From the College perspective, this information will only be visible by the relevant staff for your child and will be managed in accordance with the Privacy Act. Being in digital form, staff caring for your child will be able to have access to emergency and medical information close at hand when off site, on excursions and camps.

It is expected that all families upload and maintain current information for their child/ren. You do not need to do anything until you receive the email requesting the information. The site will also be accessible through the College app. You can also visit the Operoo website for more information: http://www.operoo.com

Car Park & Traffic Flow Procedures

We request that you note and attend to the following instructions:

■ Morning Drop-off

- 1. If you are simply dropping off your children, please do so in the designated areas before or after the roundabout on the College property. Please do not leave your cars unattended in these areas.
- 2. There is limited street parking available on Tyner Road. Please use the school crossing to cross.
- 3. Students and parents are not to walk through the staff car park area.

■ Afternoon Pick-up

- 1. All Students are dismissed at 3:30pm. The pick-up area directly in front of the Multi-purpose hall is a no standing, pick-up and go area only.
- 2. Students are not permitted to wait on Tyner Road or at the front office for parents to pick up at the end of the school day. All pick-ups are to be on the College property where we have teachers on duty.
- 3. Parents are not allowed to be onsite to pickup their children before 3:15pm


■ Traffic Flow Procedure


- The procedure requires all vehicles to: 1. Enter Tyner road (from the North) via Burwood Highway, 2. Enter Rembrandts through the first gate on the left and park in the Rembrandt's short-term 'Holding Zone' circuit, 3. Exit the 'Holding Zone' via the second Rembrandts gate,
- 4. Enter St Andrews College grounds via Gate-1, 5. Exit the College grounds into Tyner Road, 6. Proceed down Tyner Road and exit onto High St road.
- *NOTE: No Right Hand Turns into Rembrandts. All traffic flow must be from North to South
- No Parking in the Gate-1 driveway prior to 3.30pm. (this enables visitor, delivery and staff access)
- Rembrants Holding Zone only available from 2.00pm onwards



■ Parking Restrictions

Please be aware of parking restrictions in Tyner Road. Knox Council inspectors regular monitor the area and issue fines. In particular, you shouldn't park or drop off/pick up in bus zone outside the MPH

Bursary Assistance

There are limited funds available to provide bursary assistance to parents who find themselves in financial need and may need help in paying the school fees. Information and application forms are available from the College office.

■ Booklist

To ensure that the correct stationery and textbooks are supplied for students in Prep to Year 6, the College will arrange for Campion Education to supply these items direct to the College and charge parents for the associated cost. Parents of students in these Year levels will not need to purchase any stationery or textbooks. An additional charge for the Booklist supplies for Prep to Year 6 will be added to the fee account.

Booklists for Years 7 to 12 will be distributed with details of the required textbooks and stationery. We would recommend that you purchase these from Campion Education, however, you are able to purchase them from other suppliers if you wish.

Building Fund

Families are asked to donate \$500 each year to the Building Fund. A voluntary charge of \$500 will added to the fee account. If you do not wish to make this donation or would like to donate a different amount, please advise the accounts department and your account will be adjusted accordingly.

All donations to the Building Fund of \$2 and over are tax deductible. A receipt for tax purposes will be issued in June of each year.

■ Parent Participation

The College Board seeks to keep the tuition fees as low as possible. We are greatly helped in achieving this objective by parents' involvement in the Parent Participation scheme on an on-going basis and/or regular attendance at working bees.

Families can participate in the scheme by being involved in a variety of activities. During the year notices will be sent out requesting parent help at various events or activities, for example, helping at sports carnivals, covering library books, classroom help or attending working bees.

Parents are required to record the hours they have completed in the Parent Hours Book which is kept in the College Office. You will be charged a Parent Participation fee of \$250 at the commencement of each year and will be credited at the end of each semester for any work done. You will be credited at a rate of \$25 per hour of work completed, up to a maximum of \$250 for the year. The time requirement for each family is ten hours per year.

■ Application Fee

A non-refundable charge of \$100 (including GST) is payable when lodging an Application for Enrolment.

■ Enrolment Fee

A non-refundable enrolment fee of \$1,400 per student is payable on acceptance of enrolment. \$1,000 of the non-refundable Enrolment Agreement Fee will then be deducted from tuition fees for the first term of enrolment.

■ Fee Payment Arrangements

The College will charge the total yearly tuition fees and levies at the commencement of the year. Parents are required to register with the College to enable automatic monthly payments to be made which will be processed on the 20th of each month. There will be 10 monthly payments (February to November) with a final payment in December to clear any outstanding balance.

A Direct Debit Authority form will be issued with the school fee account that is sent to parents in February. Payments can be processed from bank accounts (cheque or savings) and credit cards (Visa and Mastercard only).



2025 Sports Program (Years 3-12)

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The sports program at St Andrews is a vital part of the overall schooling experience, allowing us opportunity to increase community, build teamwork, improve fitness, encourage physical activity and apply skills in a competitive environment.

Year 7 – 10 Interschool Sport

For Years 7 to 10, interschool sport will take place from approximately 1:00pm to 3:30pm on alternating Wednesday afternoons throughout Term 1, 2, 3 and 4 as part of the fortnightly timetable.

- Students have the opportunity to try out for their desired sport teams
- Students not selected for teams will take part in the College's 'Fitness Program' where they will learn different and creative ways to stay fit, active and healthy in a non-competitive environment.
- Before School Training runs weekly for those selected in the interschool teams. Trainings run from 8am – 9am, day of the week is determined by sport.

College Uniform Information

Students are expected to wear the full uniform at all times, including while travelling to and from College. Parents should ensure that their children wear the uniform as specified in the uniform lists. If any item of uniform cannot be worn, an explanatory note must be sent to the class teacher. Parents should only purchase listed uniform items from the College approved supplier:

Some second hand uniform items are available from the College uniform shop located next MPH. Open Tuesday 2:45-3:30pm (during school terms). Some items of uniform may be difficult to purchase at short notice and parents are encouraged to buy items well before they are required. There are no options for colour or style unless specified in these lists.

Full Uniforms Must Be Worn

A FULL Summer or Winter Uniform must be worn in the appropriate season, NOT a combination of both.

*Dependant on weather conditions, students will be advised of flexible change over dates

Uniform Expectations - General

- Black leather lace up school shoes only to be worn (Velcro is allowed for Prep-Year 2). Black runners/casual shoes are not permitted to be worn as school shoes.
- Shoes must be clean and polished.
- No socks below the level of the shoes are to be worn, all socks must be above the ankle and
- Ties must be worn with winter uniform (Please purchase shirts with a fused collar for use with a tie). Top button is to be buttoned when tie is worn.
- Jumper and blazer sleeves to be kept down, NOT rolled up or wrapped around the waist.
- Blazers must be worn to and from the College until the end of homeroom. with the winter school uniform for Year 7-12. It is optional to wear the blazer in Terms 1 & 4.
- Hats are a compulsory part of the uniform. In Term 1 and Term 4 it is compulsory to wear a hat when outside.
- Students are allowed to wear extra layers under their uniform as long as it is not visible.
- Shirts are to be tucked in.
- Uniforms must be worn during school days and when travelling to and from the College.
- Uniforms may be worn outside of school hours, but they must meet the uniform expectations and guidelines.

Jewellery & Piercing Expectations – All Students

- Piercings in the nose or facial area, or any normally visible part of the body, are not permitted.
- Students will be asked to remove non-permissible piercings. Clear piercing jewellery is not acceptable if the piercing is in an area that is not permitted.
- If a student cannot remove the piercing in question, they will be requested to refrain from returning to school until such time as it has been removed.
- Any other items of jewellery such as bangles, bracelets, rings, necklaces or other visible jewellery are not permitted.

Hair Expectations – General

- Junior School students are not allowed to dye their hair.
- Years 5-12 School students are allowed to dye their hair; however, this must be consistent with their own natural hair colour. No extreme colour tones will be permitted.
- Students who do not adhere to this will be requested to re-dye their hair back to its natural colour.
- Extremes in hairstyle, that draw undue attention, like shaved patterns as well as excessive braiding and plaiting of hair are not permitted.

<u>Girls Uniform</u>

Uniform Expectations

- Girls' dresses and skirts must be to the knee.
- In summer, girls may wear short white socks above the ankle. Not to be confused with anklet socks.
- Hair accessories must be in College colours white, navy or maroon.
- No make-up or nail polish to be worn, other than clear nail polish. False nails or false eye lashes are not permitted
- For girls in Senior School, skin-toned foundation/concealer and black or brown mascara may be subtly applied. It should not be immediately obvious.

Jewellery & Piercing Expectations

- Girls with pierced ears my wear one pair of gold, silver studs or sleepers only, worn in the lobe.
- No coloured stones or differing shapes allowed. No other ear piercing is acceptable.

Hair Expectations

- Fringes are to be kept well clear of the eyes.
- Where a girl's hair falls below collar level it must be all tied back.
- Shorter hairstyles must ensure that hair is off the face.

Boys Uniform

Uniform Expectations

- Jeans type or cargo type grey trousers and shorts are not acceptable.
- Students must be clean shaven no facial hair.

Jewellery & Piercing Expectations

Ear piercings are not permitted.

Jewellery & Hair Expectations

- Neat haircuts are required, with hair to be groomed at all times. Hair must be off the collar and fringe length must be off the face and not tucked behind the ears.
- Examples of inappropriate styling include, but are not limited to: tails, mohawks, shaven heads, dreadlocks, undercuts, lines, no shorter than No. 2 clipper/combs and extreme high fade.
- Where hair is collar length or longer, students will be expected to neatly tie it up.





Sports Uniform

Sports Uniform Expectations

- No legging/compression style pants or shorts are permitted.
- No branded sports socks are permitted and only white in colour. Socks must be above the ankle.
- Flesh coloured compression shorts are permitted under sport uniform.
- Only St Andrews sports uniform items are permitted to be worn,
- Sports uniform is only to be worn on days when PE lessons or sport activities are scheduled. The sports uniform is

NOT to be worn as a substitute for the school uniform.


